

# The scarcity of water is one of the biggest challenges facing rural India. Together with village communities, the Sehgal Foundation team works in water-scarce regions to secure and sustain local water supplies, help villagers improve sanitation, and manage wastewater in schools, homes, and elsewhere within the community. Without potable water in schools, it's not possible to cook the government-provided midday meals, and many children leave school early in the day to go home to drink water. Most do not return for the rest of the day. Girls miss school altogether because they

have to spend hours each day fetching water for their families.





# **ENSURING SAFE WATER IN SCHOOLS**

In schools that previously had no source of water, pressurized recharge wells, extending above and below the groundwater table, create fresh water pockets in saline water zones and make it possible for children to have clean water for drinking and sanitation purposes. Rainwater harvested from the school rooftops creates hydrostatic pressure and slowly pushes aside any existing saline groundwater. This fresh water is extracted from underground with a hand pump, and a bio-sand filter removes the biological contaminants, making the water fit for drinking.

### **MAKING A DIFFERENCE**

Serving about 500 children in one school, this technology ensures local water supplies for drinking, sanitation, and cooking of the midday meal. This has resulted in increased enrollment and retention of students, especially girls, in seven schools in Mewat district, Haryana. Many other schools in saline water areas can benefit from such pressurized recharge wells. In addition for use in schools, this technology can be replicated at the household and community levels and across semi-arid regions with inland salinity.
