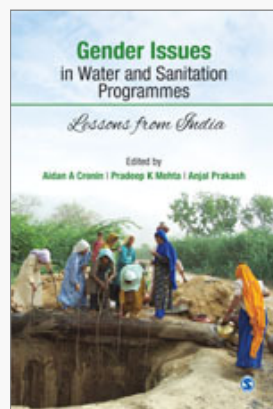


# Gender Issues in Water and Sanitation Programmes
