
### Agriculture Development

HELPING FARMERS SUSTAINABLY PRODUCE MORE

S M Sehgal Foundation's Agriculture Development Program works with farmers as partners in creating better futures. Most farmers in rural India are small or marginal, often facing the weight of high input costs, limited credit, and uncertain markets. With the aim of reaching a large number of farmers, the foundation started working to strengthen Farmer Producer Organizations (FPOs) to help small and marginal farmers move forward together. The foundation helps FPOs pool resources, access credit, secure better prices, and adopt improved farming practices. This support raises productivity and enables farming families associated with FPOs to build more stable and dignified livelihoods.

*Vrishabhavati* Agriculture Farmer Producer Company began with challenges familiar to many small farmer collectives: low awareness of FPO operations, difficulty in raising capital, and reliance on traditional farming methods. With only 300 members contributing Rs. 3 lakhs in share capital, the organization struggled to meet expectations.

**S M Sehgal Foundation** partnered with the FPO to strengthen its base. Regular village meetings, technical trainings, and exposure visits introduced members to modern cultivation practices. Over time, membership grew to 1,000 with Rs. 10 lakhs in share capital. The FPO expanded its business by starting an input shop, a custom hiring center, and small-scale processing units. A ragi mill, cold storage facility, and branded sales through the Amruth stall boosted both income and visibility. Women members also began to participate actively through apiculture, goat rearing, and agarbatti production. A polyhouse for capsicum cultivation added another profitable enterprise.



### Water Management





Ensuring water security plays a dual role in securing communities against both floods and droughts. When ponds, tanks, and other traditional water bodies are restored through measures such as desiltation, bund strengthening, and recharge structures, they gain the capacity to hold excess rainfall during heavy downpours, reducing the risk of overflow and flooding. At the same time, these structures allow water to percolate into the ground, replenishing aquifers and ensuring availability during dry months.

S M Sehgal Foundation's work in Water Management reduces water stress, provides resilience against climate extremes, and creates a reliable source of water security for rural communities.

When torrential rains and swollen streams inundated villages around Vijayawada in September 2024, Atukuru village in Krishna District, Andhra Pradesh, stood out as an exception. A year earlier, under a CSR-supported project, S M Sehgal Foundation brought together the community, panchayat, TUG members, and the irrigation department to revive Vura Cheruvu - the village's 60-acre pond. Through desiltation, bund strengthening, and the construction of recharge structures, its capacity was enhanced by 60 million litres.





### Transform Lives one school

at a time

ENVIRONMENT FOR SCHOOL CHILDREN




Children in rural India often remain cut off from the digital world, limiting their opportunities to engage with the wider global community. To address this digital gap, S M Sehgal Foundation has introduced digital libraries in rural schools. This initiative is helping students gain access to technology, narrowing the divide, and opening new pathways for advancing girls' education.



Shalu, a Class 11 student at **Government Senior Secondary** School in Indergarh, Alwar, Rajasthan, hails from a farming family. Her school benefits from a digital library established by S M Sehgal Foundation, providing students with training in digital and life skills. Shalu, was particularly interested in mobile applications and their development. In December 2024, Shalu participated in the Rajasthan Yuva Mahotsav organized by the Rajasthan government. She created a presentation on mobile applications for the digital fair, emphasizing their benefits and limitations.





# Local Participation & Sustainability

BUILDING CAPACITIES FOR INCLUSIVE AND SUSTAINABLE DEVELOPMENT




True progress happens when communities unite around a shared purpose. A core approach towards building empowerment within the communities stands on getting the communities to work and build together, which extends beyond the project's completion. Central to Local Participation and Sustainability, the foundation helps ensure that the strength built within communities continues to thrive long after a project ends.

In Badaelaki, a Haryana village of 1,400, families once spent up to Rs. 12,000 a year on tankers because the groundwater was too saline to drink. In 2024 S M Sehgal Foundation set up a Village Leadership School to build local leadership and awareness of entitlements, under a CSR-project. When water surfaced as the community's top concern, villagers petitioned the Deputy Commissioner. Within months, a pipeline and chamber brought clean water under the Jal Jeevan Mission.



Today, safe water flows in Badaelaki, and families put their savings toward children's education and household needs.

## Outreach for Development





The Outreach for Development (OFD) at S M Sehgal Foundation works to bridge the information divide among all stakeholders, including the grassroots communities, by making knowledge timely, accessible, and relatable. Through digital platforms, social media, podcasts, interactive IEC materials, and Community Radio Connect FM 107.8, the team amplifies local voices, shares the Foundation's initiatives, and builds greater visibility for development work.

In rural India, radio remains a trusted companion and a powerful tool for change. The *Kanoon Ki Baat* series on *Connect* FM 107.8, created with District Legal Services Authorities, became a lifeline for villagers seeking clarity on laws that impact daily life. Over 32 live phone-in episodes where judges, lawyers, and para-legal experts addressed questions on child marriage, dowry, women's rights, land laws, and domestic violence. What began as conversations turned into empowerment, with listeners gaining the confidence to seek justice and exercise their rights.

Similarly, *Humare Buzurg, Humara Samaan*, supported by the Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment, Gol, used 24 episodes to spark dialogue on respect, inclusion, and care for the elderly, transforming attitudes through relatable storytelling.

These initiatives highlight how radio-driven communication goes beyond sharing information. It reshapes mindsets, mobilizes communities, and reinforces the power of communication as a tool for lasting behavior change.

### Overall Communications Outreach (FY 2024–25)

More than 300 stories and features appeared in international, national, and regional media.

12 new IEC materials were designed to present critical information in formats suited to diverse audiences.

The SMSF website engaged 92,519 users through organic search, including 13,100 repeat visitors.

# Rural Research & Technology Innovation


TRANSLATING EVIDENCE TO ACTION



Rural Research assesses the impact that onground interventions yield to understand what works and what doesn't. Using a mixed methods approach, research is an integral component of the project lifecycle, from initiation to completion. It helps measure the impact we create on the ground and ensures sustainability in the long run.

Adaptive Technology initiative focuses on piloting innovations in water, agriculture, and education with the purpose of integrating new advancements to enrich developmental solutions and to create impact at scale. Integrating tech-based solutions through the use of artificial intelligence is undertaken to make programs and processes more efficient and result-driven.

### Financials



In FY 2024-25, the Sehgal Foundation USA grants to S M Sehgal Foundation amounted to US\$ 2,467,840 (Rs. 207,005,477). S M Sehgal Foundation also received funding from other organizations amounting to US\$ 8,726,227 (Rs. 731,966,699). To date the total grants from Sehgal Foundation, USA have been \$ 42,433,279 (Rs. 2,614,168,406).

These grants and other income (interest, community contribution and office space rental – net of expenses for leased space) were used for water management (36%); agricultural development (34%); rural research and technology innovation (2%); local participation and sustainability (8%); outreach for development and fundraising (3%); Transform Lives (9%) and general administration (8%).
